



TRAINING PROGRAM ON CLINICAL SEXOLOGY IN CHRONIC RENAL INSUFFICIENCY PATIENTS: A QUALITATIVE EVALUATION OF PARTICIPANTS

Objective:

Improve sexological knowledge and consciousness in patients and health professionals

Avoid arising of pathological consequences in CRI patients and provide suitable counseling tools



Design and Methods:

Participation of 67 members of dialysis unit

Submitted and completed Sternberg triangle test and a body perception test on “sensitive body zones”

Lectures included interactive discussion after presentation of slides, scientific movies and readings



Results:

- 84% felt better informed on how to deal with sexual issues in dialysis patients
- 86% appreciated the course design and method
- 82% found the course useful and relevant for their profession
- 69% found the duration of the course appropriate (12 hours)
- 31% felt the need for additional sessions



Conclusions:

Gaining awareness of one's own behaviour and rigidity can greatly improve relationships with patients
